YOUTH STORY DOOR APPLICATION

The Michigan City Public Library is proud to provide free access to library materials for our homebound cardholders through our Story Door program. The program has been part of our library for many years with recently included updates to make it an even more positive and enriching experience for our patrons.

Library items can be sent to our adult and youth patrons who are temporarily or permanently unable to visit the library due to physical or intellectual disability, mental health challenges, vision impairment, illness, injury, or incapacitation. Delivery and return of materials is by the U.S. Postal Service and postage will be paid for both ways.

Attached is a Story Door application. Once the forms are completed and returned, we will set up an account for you. You will then begin receiving two items in the mail. You may certainly return items sooner in order to receive a new shipment as soon as possible.

Please review the following youth program conditions:



- Only 2 items are sent through the mail at a time.
- Materials are due in 2 months. A due date receipt will be provided.
- Late fees are .15 per item per day.
- Simple instructions on how to return items will be included in your first mailing.
- A parent or guardian with a youth Story Door patron under the age of 18 on their card is responsible for their late, lost, or damaged material charges.
- A youth Story Door patron who is 16 years or older and would like to apply for their own card must have a photo ID and proof of address to show Michigan City Library District residency. They will be responsible for any late, lost or damaged item fees.
- Movies only from the Youth Services department can be checked out to those who are under the age of 18.
- Patrons are not allowed to participate in the program and visit the library to check out items since they receive the privilege of an extended loan period and benefit from postage paid both ways.
- Newly released items and bestsellers can only be checked out 6 months after they are published due to their popularity.
